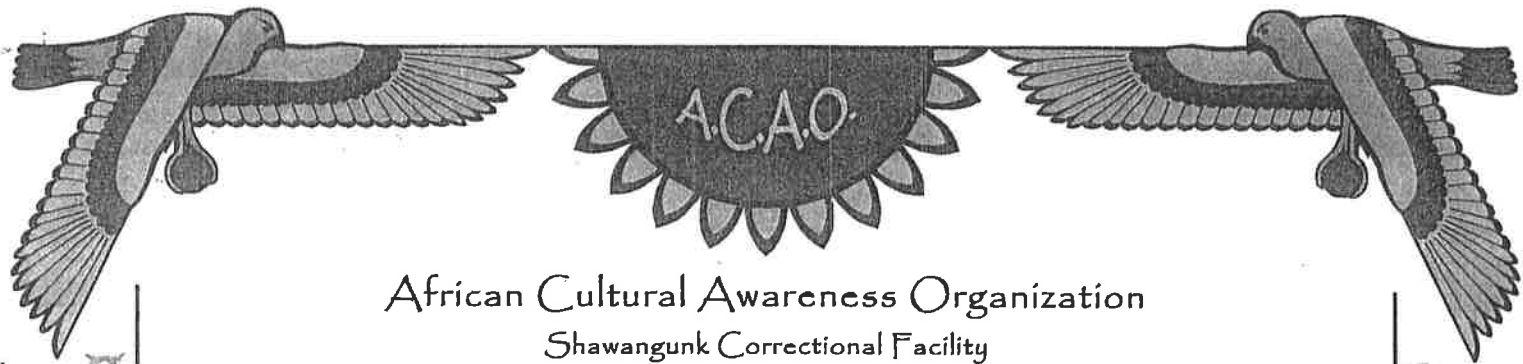
In these areas, as well as other volunteer programs Mr. Jova participates in, he is a role model and an asset. He has

Finally, with the writing and submission of his prison memoir on transcending materialism entitled "For the Love of Money" for the ACAO's unpublished compilation of personal prison stories of transformation (i.e., "Our Stories: Reflections from the Other Side of the Wall," 2009), Mr. Jova has taken a giant step toward self-improvement and, concomitantly, he has presented a blueprint that others can use to make comparable transformations. In short, his time spent here has been paved with contributions toward the "greatest good," that is, the uplift of his fellow human beings. 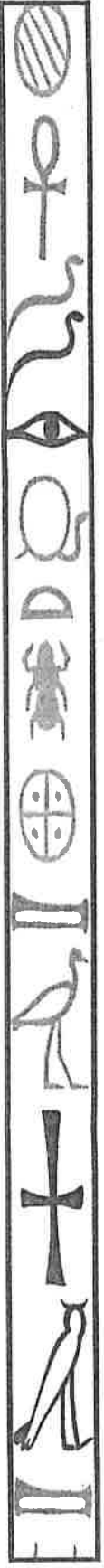
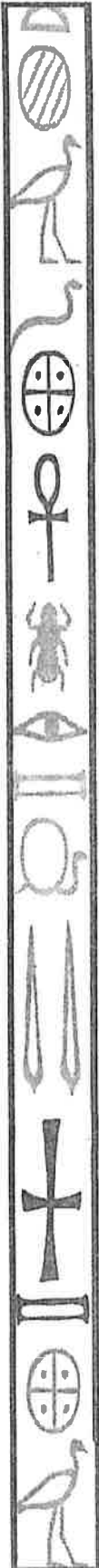
